This agreement made and entered into this 6th day of July, 1939, by and between Mable S. Nelson, of Greenville, S. C., and H. E. Goodman, of Greenville, S. C.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, on or about the 20th day of September, 1938, the said Mable S. Nelson and the said H. E. Goodman entered into a written agreement with respect to the lease of certain property descirbed in said agreement for the term beginning on October 1, 1938, and ending September 30, 1943, and further providing that at the expiration of said lease the said H. E. Goodman had the exclusive option or right of purchasing outright said property at the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty (\$1750.00) Dollars, said agreement having been recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina on June 20, 1939, in Volume 306, 2/ at Page 2-11; and
