QUIT CLAIM DEED.

THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into on this the 13th day of August, 1940, between The Buckeye Cotton Oil Company, a corporation organized and doing business under the laws of the State of Ohio, with its principal office in Cincinnati, Ohio, party of the first part, and C. G. Gunter, Inc., a corporation organized and doing business under the laws of the State of South Carolina, having, its principal office in Greenville; South Carolina, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

That the party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) and other valuable considerations, to it in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has bargained, sold, and by these presents does remise, release and forever quit-claim unto the said C. G. Gunter, Inc., its successors and assigns, all the right, title, interest, claim or demand the said Buckeye Cotton Oil Company has or may have had in and to the following described property, to-wit:

All that certain lot of land situate in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on south side of Old Hundred Road, said pin being approximately 50 feet west from the northwest corner of property conveyed by Woodville Investment Company to Mrs. Cordia V. Wood, on February 8, 1933, by deed recorded in Volume 172, at page 130, and running thence with Old Hundred Road S. 85 W. 211 feet to an iron pin; thence south 13-30 E. 175 feet 4 inches to an iron pin; thence N. 77-15 E. 179 feet 6 inches to iron pin; thence N. 2-30 E. 150 feet to the beginning corner, containing 7/10 of an acre, according to survey of G. A. Ellis, made September 26, 1935.

Being the lot on which is situate the Woodville Gin and Seed House, together with all the buildings, machinery, equipment and appliances situate thereon and belonging to the Mortgagor and used in connection with said Gin, and being the same property conveyed to C.
