in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Arthur E. Cox.

All of my right, title and interest in and to all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Saluda Township, County, State of South Carolina, originally containing 226 acres, more or less, and being more particularly described in deed to John Cox dated February 17, 1877, and recorded in Deed Book II, page 74, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County. Reference to said deed is hereby craved for a more particular description. The grantee herein is already the owner of approximately 21 acres, designated as bottom land of said above tract, and this deed is given to convey all interest whatever which I may have in and to the remaining portion of said tract which consists primarily of mountain land.

Mary Cox Boswell above referred to was a sister of the grantee herein, and was one of the seven children of John Cox.
