Second. The name of the proposed Corporation is Altamont Bible and Missionary Institute.

Third. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is

Greenville County, S. C.

Fourth. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is

To receive, enroll, discharge, train, instruct students in all lines of common education in the sciences and languages incidental thereto, and in the study of the Bible, and to train and prepare Christian workers, evangelists and missionaries; to enforce good order, to make by laws and rules, to appoint trustees, officers and teachers for the same; to hold religious services and commencements, to conduct examinations and grant certificates of proficiency, scholarships, and graduation; to receive donations, make purchases, receive conveyances; to mortgage and encumber under certain limitations, and effect alienations of realty and personalty, not for the purpose of trade and profit, but for promoting the general design of such institution, and to look after the general interests of such establishment, also to collect and dissominate religious and missionary information, and receive and transmit contributions for religious and missionary purposes; to hold religious services and conferences anywhere in this State and other states and countries, and all such corporate powers as may be suitable and not inconsistent with the laws of this State, nor violative of private rights.
