County, State of South Carolina, known as the home place of W. L. Plumley, deceased, and containing
280 acres, bounded by lands now or formerly of W. H. Plumley, J. E. Morgan, D. M. Lockhart Estate,
Claude Pierce, John Pierce, T. H. Reid, John Pierce, Wilborn Gosnell, and D. R. Evans, and as
shown on a plat or sub-division of said lands made by W. P. Morrow Nov. 16, 1933, to which plat
reference is made for a full and complete description as to metes and bounds.
