WHEREAS, Robert H. Hodgens, Daniel H. McKinney, and Fulton V. Clinkscales both of Taylors, S. C.

did on the 29th day of October, 1945, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Superior Cleaners and Laundry

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Taylors, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is General cleaning and general laundering of clothing, linens, rugs, curtains, textiles fabrics and other items, also cleaning hats and blocking hats of all kinds that will come under these heads. Also anything that will be required to carry on the business of cleaning and laundrying.

Further, to buy and sell real estate, to buy and sell personal property, to mortgage real or personal property and borrow money or secure credit for the purpose of promoting the advancement of the Corporation. Further, the Corporation may have the right to carry on any other commercial business that may be considered advantageous to the corporation.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, payable 83% in cash, the balance to be paid on demand.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One hundred (100) of the par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 25th day of October, 1945, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: Robert H. Hodgens, Daniel H. McKinney, Fulton V. Clinkscales.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Robert H. Hodgens as Vice-President, Daniel H. McKinney; as Secretary, Fulton V. Clinkscales as Treasurer, Daniel H. McKinney

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

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NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
