TRACT NO. 9.

All that tract or parcel of land in Greenville County, South Carolina, conveyed to Piedmont Manufacturing Company by C. D. Nesbitt and S. F. Trowbridge by deed dated January 24, 1883, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book NN at page 605, and being described in said deed as follows:

All that tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid on the East side of the Columbia and Greenville Railroad, adjoining lands of Jas. H. Payne, Jas. F. Iler and the said Piedmont Manufacturing Company, and others,

Iler by deed dated January 24, 1883, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book NN at page 607, and being described in said deed as follows:

All that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid on the East side of the Columbia and Greenville Railroad just above the Piedmont Depot, adjoining lands of Nesbitt and Trowbridge, James H. Payne, Amos Eskew, Piedmont Mfg. Co. and others.

BEGINNING at a stone 3xon the line of the said Railroad, being also Nesbitt and Trowbridge corner, and running thence S, 76 1/2 E. 5.40 chs. to a Black gum 3x on the branch; thence up the meanderings of the said branch say 21.70 chs. to a stone 3x on Amos Eskew line; thence with Amos Eskew's line S. 87 W. 7.59 chs. to a point on the said Railroad; thence down the track of said Railroad to the beginning containing 16 1/2 acres, more or less.
