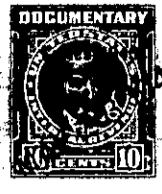

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J.H. Thomason,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Sixty-eight Hundred
... (\$6800.00) ... Dollars

to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
by Norval H. Floyd

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Norval H. Floyd and his heirs
and assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, one mile West from the City of Greer, lying
on the West side of Brockman Street, and being a portion of Lots
Nos. 99 and 100 of the W.H. Brockman Estate as shown on Plat thereof
by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, recorded in Plat Book "H", at page
132, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, and particularly surveyed
and platted as the property of Norval H. Floyd by H.S. Brockman,
Surveyor, on May 4, 1949, and having the following courses and
distances, to wit: Beginning at an iron pin on the Western margin
of the sidewalk of Brockman Street, Northeast corner of said lot
and 175 feet Southward from the Old National Highway No. 29, and
running thence N. 78.00 W. 140 feet to iron pin, new corner;
thence S. 12.00 W. 58 feet to iron pin, new corner; thence S. 78.00 E.
140 feet to iron pin on margin of sidewalk of said Brockman Street;
thence along said sidewalk, N. 12.00 E. 58 feet to the beginning
corner.
