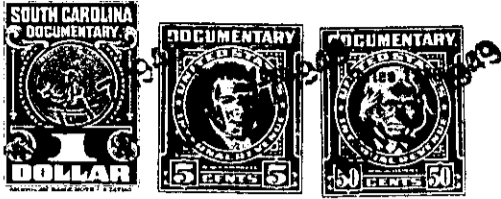

located on White Horse Road. About 5 miles south of Greenville, S. C., and having the following metes and bounds to-wit. Beginning at an iron pin on right of way of White Horse Road. Running thence S 61 - 45 W 396.2 feet with lands owned by K. Howard to an iron pin. Thence N 33 - 00 W 50.2 feet alongside lands of Hugh T. Myers to an iron pin. Thence N 57 00 E 388.7 feet with lands of H.C. Granger to an iron pin on right of way of White Horse Road. (Highway 250). Thence along the said White Horse Road S 36-49 E to the beginning corner.
