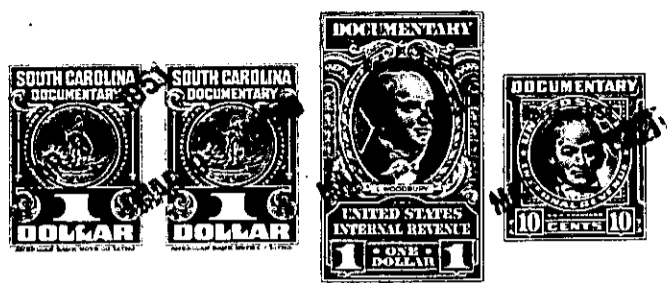

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as Lot No. 9
in Section B of the property known as Woodville Heights, according
to a plat thereof made by W.J. Riddle, Surveyor, in December, 1940,
and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S.C., in
Plat Book "L" at pages 14 and 15, and having according to said plat
the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the western side of Oak Street
at the joint front corners of Lots Nos. 9 and 10 and
running with Oak Street S. 45-40 E. 70 feet to an iron
pin at the joint front corner of Lots Nos. 8 and 9; thence
with the joint line of Lots Nos. 8 and 9 S. 14-30 W. 135
feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 8 and
9; thence N. 44-12 W. 70 feet to an iron pin, joint corner
of Lots 9 and 11; thence S. 41-20 W. 67 feet to the joint
rear corner of Lots Nos. 10 and 11; thence continuing in
a straight line 67 feet to the beginning point on Oak Street.
