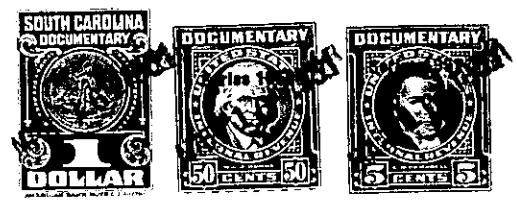

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That we, Amy S. Woodson, Wm. V. Woodson, Jr., Frances Woodson Graham (heirs of W. V. Woodson) and R. J. Drummond of Greenville County in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Henry N. Fisher (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Henry N. Fisher, and his heirs and assigns,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina in the City of Greenville, in Ward One of said City, and having the following metes and bounds according to a survey made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, September, 1921, to-wit:

Commencing at an iron pipe 217 feet southwest from the south side of Park Avenue at the rear corner of Coleman Property, and running thence along said line N. 14-30 E. 71 feet to an iron pipe in edge of a branch, thence up the branch and along rear line of lots facing Park Avenue as follows: N. 77-56 W. 100 feet to iron pipe, N. 65-34 W. 50.5 feet to iron pipe, N. 68 W. 25.8 feet to iron pipe on line of Marshall property; thence along line of Marshall property S. 2-15 E. 113 feet to iron pipe; thence with line of same property S. 87 E. 145.5 feet to the beginning corner.

Also, all of our right, title and interest in and to a certain drive-way ten feet in width, extending from Park Avenue to the lot of land herein described, said drive-way being between the property now or formerly owned by Trammell and Stover.

This is the land conveyed to W. V. Woodson and R. J. Drummond by T. R. Bull by his deed dated 23rd day of February, 1923, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Volume #89, page 197.
