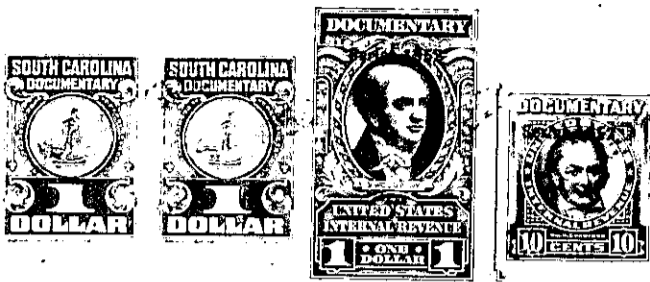

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these  
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said William W. Evans, and Edith C.  
Evans, their heirs, and assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina, being more particularly described by a plat  
of same, made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, December 21, 1951, and  
recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South  
Carolina in Plat Book A A at page 100, and having according to  
said plat the following metes and bounds to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at the corner of property now owned  
by Lucy M. Cisson on a County Road, running between the White Horse  
Road and the Saluda Dam Road; and running thence S. 235 W. 20.6  
feet across said Road to an iron pin; thence S. 2-35 W. 303.2 feet  
to an iron pin; thence S. 85-3 W. 281.2 feet to an iron pin; thence  
N.19-15 E. 335.2 feet continuing in a line across said County Road  
to an iron pin; thence N. 86-15 E. 184 feet to the point of beginning  
and containing One and Sixty-one one-hundredths of an acre, more or
