All that piece, parcel or lot of land in O'Neal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina about three miles east from Travelers Rest, S. C., on the North side of the McElhany Road and on the South side of the Log Ford Road and on the waters of the Enoree River, and having the following courses and distances, to wit:

BEGINNING at a stone on the Pine Log Ford Road and running thence S $77\frac{1}{4}$ W 22.50 to a stone on said road; thence S $4\text{-}\frac{3}{4}$ W 22.75 to a stone on the McElhany Ford Road; thence S 83 E 1.90 along said road to a stone; thence N $49\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ E 28.41 to a stone; thence S 8 E 2.20 to a stone; thence N $50\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ E 12.25 to a stone on a road; thence N 54 W 2.11 to a P.O.; thence N $77\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ W 4.70 to a P.O.; thence N 78 W 2.20 to a stone; thence N 44 W .75 to the beginning corner, and containing Forty-Three and One-Half (43.50) Acres, more or less, and being formerly bounded by lands of Mrs. S. E., Surveyor, dated October 20, 1904, and to be recorded in the Office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County, and having, according to said plat, the following courses and distances, to wit:

BEGINNING on a Red Oak stump on the North bank of the McElhany Road and running thence N 5 E 22.58 to a stone 3x o.m. on the North side of Piney Log Ford Road; thence S $78\text{-}\frac{1}{4}$ W 8.06 to a stone 3x o.m.; thence S 15 E 5.20 to a stone 3x n.m. in Piney Log Ford Road; thence with said road to a stake 3x n.m. in branch where the branch crosses said road; thence S $13\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ E 12.00 to a stone 3x n.m. in McElhany Road; thence S 16 W 52.20 chs. to a stone 3x n.m. on the North bank of Beaver Dam Creek; thence down said Creek S 76 E 7.60 to a stake 3x where L. P. Pooles line crosses; thence with L. P. Pooles line N $2\text{-}\frac{3}{4}$ E 6.20 to a stone 3x o.m.; thence N $10\text{-}\frac{3}{4}$ E 6.50 to a stone 3x o.m.; thence N $20\text{-}\frac{1}{4}$ E 40.10 to the beginning corner, and containing Forty-Seven and One-Half (47.50) Acres, more or less.
