All that parcel or tract of land, situate on the West side of the Greenville-Laurens Road (also known as U. S. Highway 276), about one mile North of the Town of Mauldin, in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being shown as Tract 3 on plat of Property of T. M. Hunt Estate, made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, December 1951, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book BB, page 13, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin in the center of the Greenville-Laurens Road at joint front corner of Tracts 3 and 4 and running thence along the line of Tract 4, S. 42-45 W. 1334.4 feet to an iron pin in the line of Tract 5; thence along the line of Tract 5, S. 18-05 E. 473.2 feet to an iron pin; thence along the line of Tract 2, N. 42-45 E. 1334.4 feet more or less to a point in the center of the Greenville-Laurens Road; thence along the center of said road, N. 18-05 W. 473.2 feet to the beginning corner. Contains 12.37 acres.

This is a portion of that tract of land conveyed to T. M. Hunt by deed of D. M. Smith, et al, as executor of E. S. Smith, deceased, dated April 14, 1928, recorded in the R. M. C.
