All those certain four pieces, parcels or tracts of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, and in Oaklawn Township, containing in the aggregate approximately 154 acres, be the same more or less, and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Tract No. 1: Being known and designated as Tract No. 2 of a subdivision of the property of Narcissus N. Anderson, as shown on plat thereof recorded in the R.M.C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book E, at pages 74 to 77, containing 37.5 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin in the center of Holland's Ford road at the corner of Tract No. 3, and running thence along the center of said Holland's Ford Road, N. 46-3/4 W. 755 feet to an iron pin at the corner of Tract No. 1; thence along the line of Tract No. 1, S. 28-45 W. 688 feet to a cherry tree at branch; thence down center of said branch as the line to a point just north of where two branches converge; thence S. 64-26 E. 790 feet to an iron pin at the rear corner of Tract No. 3; thence along the line of that tract, N. 20 E. 1823 feet to the beginning corner.
