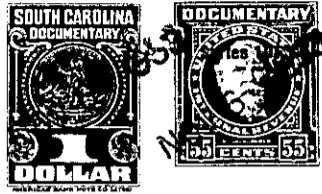

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That John T. McClure

and J. J. McClure

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars and other valuable con- siderations

to them in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Sherman Hudson and wife, Ida Mae L. Hudson

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sherman Hudson and wife, Ida Mae L. Hudson

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina :

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the J. E. Henson northeast corner and runs thence with J. Calhoun line South 74° 50 min east 469.2 feet to a stake on the northwest corner of Lot #2A; thence with line of Lot #2A south 27° 44 min. west 80.4 feet to a tack in pavement of Old Appalachian Highway, said tack being also the southwest corner of Lot #2A; thence with the Old Appalachian Highway and J. T. McClure and J. J. McClure line north 87° 56 min. west 510.2 feet to tack, J. E. Henson's southeast corner; thence with the J. E. Henson line north 28° .04 min. east 199.1 feet passing the iron pin offset 29 feet to the point of BEGINNING.

Being a portion of the property described in a deed from Sherman McClure to J. T. McClure and J. J. McClure, dated the 9th day of November, 1922, recorded in Book H on page 595 of the R. M. C. Office of Greenville County, South Carolina.
