in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One And No/100 Dollar (\$1.00) and correction of deed Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by George T. Tucker and Myrtle F. Tucker

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said George T. Tucker and Myrtle F. Tucker, their Heirs and Assigns forever;

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Welcome School District Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, as shown on plat of property of George T. Tucker made by Woodward Engineering Company, January, 1956 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Welcome Road and running thence S. 22-20 W. 202 feet to an iron pin; thence with line of other property of the Grantor S. 71-08 E. 79.7 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 22-20 E. 258 feet to an iron pin on Welcome Road; thence with Welcome Road S. 74-55 W. 100 feet to an iron pin, the beginning corner.
