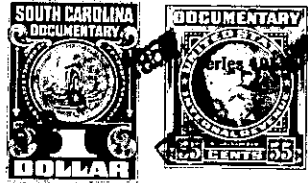

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Austin Township, Greenville County, State

of South Carolina, adjoining lands now or formerly of the Estate of W. J. McKinney, the Estate of J. P. Hughes, lands of P. E. Hughes and Henry Hart and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a stone, W. J. McKinney's corner, and running thence, S. 3-
1/4 E. 4.90 ch. to stone 3x; thence S. 83-3/4 W. 17.56 to iron pin, Henry
Hart's corner; thence N. 4-3/4 E. along Hart's line 5.00 to stone 3x;
thence N. 83-3/4 E. 16.85 to the beginning corner, containing 8.40
acres, more or less, being the same tract of land conveyed to A. J.
McKinney by J. A. McKinney by deed dated January 8, 1921 and recorded
in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 71, page 562,
and being the same property conveyed to Ola Morton by deed of A. J.
McKinney dated April 27, 1932 and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for
Greenville County in Deed Book 161, page 160.

ALSO, all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Austin Township, Green-
ville County, State of South Carolina, containing 93.27 acres, said
93.27 acres consisting of the 44.48 acres, more or less, conveyed to
R. H. Morton by W. H. Boseman by deed dated November 1, 1905 recorded
in the R.M.C. Office in Deed Book O.O.O., page 797, and the 28.13
acres, more or less, conveyed to R.H. Morton by F. E. Todd by deed dated
January 24, 1921, recorded in Deed Book 48, page 594, and the 12 acres,
more or less, conveyed to R. H. Morton by John W. Putman by deed dated
January 10, 1917, recorded in Deed Book 44, page 26, and the 8.56 acres,
more or less, conveyed to R. H. Morton by F. M. Todd by deed dated
December 29, 1919, recorded in Deed Book 56, page 508.

The grantors above named, together with Florence Barksdale, constitute
the children of Elizabeth Barksdale who died intestate and said Eliza-
beth Barksdale was one of eleven children of Richard Henry Morton who
died intestate.
