County, South Carolina, in Plat Book KK, at page 89.
The said sub-division lies Northwest of Duncan Chapel
Road (S. C. Highway No. 250), and the streets therein
have such lines, courses, distances and names as are
shown on the plat herein referred to.

This conveyance is made for street and road purposes and inclusion of the property herein conveyed in the Greenville County roadway system.

This property is a part of that conveyed by Furman University to The Peoples National Bank of Greenville, S. C., as Agent for Furman University on February 25, 1957, by deed recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Vol. 567, at page 397.

The grantor specifically reserves to itself, its successors and assigns, any and all water lines installed in the streets or roadways hereby conveyed, together with the right and easement at all times to repair, replace and maintain the same in a proper manner and condition; provided, that in the exercise of such right and easement, the grantor shall repair the damage, if any, caused to such streets and roadways.
