CHARTER

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

J. M. PERRY and M. G. SPEARS

both of

Greenville, S. C.

did on the 9th day of Columbia, 1958, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is LIBERTY LOAN CORPORATION OF COLUMBIA

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is

To lend money to any person, firm or corporation, secured by the obligation of such person, firm or corporation or otherwise.

To buy, sell and exchange real, personal or mixed property.

To operate under any lending statute or industrial loan act of any state.

To operate under any statute or court decision authorizing the lending of money and the issuance, in connection with such loans or otherwise, certificates of investment or indebtedness, requiring regular installment payments thereon, with or without interest, and with or without security.
