

to us paid by Robert A. Dobson, Jr., Trustee for G. B. Nalley, Robert A. Dobson, Jr., Harry R. Stephenson, Jr. and William K. Stephenson, under Agreement dated March 2, 1959,

in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and re-

leased, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Robert A. Dobson, Jr., Trustee for G. B. Nalley, Robert A. Dobson, Jr., Harry R. Stephenson, Jr. and William K. Stephenson, under Agreement dated March 2, 1959, his successors and assigns forever:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in

Chick Springs

Township, Greenville County, State

of South Carolina, lying and being at the southeasterly corner of the intersection of Old Chick Springs Road and Buncombe Road, near the Town of Greer, containing 18.12 acres, more or less, according to a survey plat made by C. F. Webb, dated February 23, 1959, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book MM, page 87 and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point in the center of the intersection of Old Chick Springs Road and Buncombe Road, said point being located 511.5 feet, more or less, in a southeasterly direction from the intersection of Buncombe Road and U. S. Super Highway No. 29, and running thence along the center line of Old Chick Springs Road the following courses and distances: N 58-10 E 231 feet to a point; N 64-10 E 100 feet to a point; N 67-55E 200 feet to a point; and N 71-05 E 174.1 feet to a point; thence turning and running S 47-13 E 1422 feet to an iron pin on the northerly side of the 100 foot right-of-way (of the P. & N. Railroad; thence turning and running along the northerly edge of said right-of-way, following the curvature thereof, the following courses and distances: N. 81-00 W 700 feet to a point; N 82-25 W 100 feet to a point; N 85-25 W 100 feet to a point; N 89-15 W 100 feet to a point; S 86-15 W 100 feet to a point; S 82-15 W 100 feet to a point; and S 77-35 W 132.5 feet to a point in the center of the right-of-way of Buncombe Road under the end of a bridge crossing said Railroad right-of-way; thence turning and running along the center line of the right-of-way of Buncombe Road N 31-55 W 698.5 feet to the point of beginning. This tract of land was formerly shown from an incomplete survey as a tract containing 17.9 acres on the plat of the C. L. King Estate as recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Plat Book Y, page 59.

The grantors do further convey unto the grantee, his successors and assigns, all of the right, title and interest which they hold as Trustees in and to the 100 foot right-of-way of the P. & N. Railroad which adjoins the tract of land hereinabove described on the southerly side. This grant of interest is in the nature of a quitclaim and is specifically exempted from the warranty of this deed.

The tract of land hereinabove described is a part of the land conveyed to Charles L. King by deed of Horace L. King, et al., dated July 23, 1883, and recorded in said RMC Office in Deed Book 00, page 395. The said Charles L. King died testate of August 29, 1944, leaving in force and effect his last will and testament dated August 19, 1944,
