That This Conveyance, and all right, title and interest hereby conveyed in the prop-
erty above described, is, and at all times shall be, limited to a right of interment only there-
in, and is subject at all times to the rules and regulations and by-laws of said Corporation,
on file in its office, now existing and/or which may be by it hereafter adopted either by
amendment, alteration or the adoption of new ones, and which are specifically referred
to and herein inserted as if set forth in full; all of which are conditions, reservations and
restrictions, and are binding upon the Grantee, his heirs, devisees, executors, adminis-
