

And it is understood that either of these parties has the right to apply in any court of proper jurisdiction for a permanent divorce, - but it shall be provided in the decree of any such divorce that the other party shall have the right to remarry.

And unto these covenants each party hereby binds himself or herself, and his or her heirs, personal representatives, and assigns forever.
