

This is a portion of that property conveyed to Adeline A. Hudson by deed of S. J. Douthit, Probate Judge for Greenville County, dated November 27, 1878, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Deed Book JJ, Page 154. Subsequently, Adeline A. Hudson died intestate leaving as her sole heirs at law her husband, E. A. Hudson, and three children, Eula E. Hudson, Perry E. Hudson and Arthur L. Hudson, all of which is more fully shown by reference to Apt. 93, File 21, Office of the Probate Court for Greenville County. The said E. A. Hudson died intestate thereafter leaving as his sole heirs at law Eula E. Hudson, Perry E. Hudson and Arthur L. Hudson. Subsequently, Arthur L. Hudson died intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Carolyn P. Hudson, one of the Grantors herein, and Helen H. Bishop, his only child, one of the Grantors herein. Subsequently, Eula E. Hudson died and by her Will, which is on file in Apt. 385, File 14, Probate Court for Greenville County, she devised her interest in the above property to her nephew, the Grantor herein; Roy O. Hudson. Subsequently, Perry E. Hudson died intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Eva L. Hudson, one of the Grantors herein, and his children, Homer C. Hudson, Lucille H. Jones, Roy O. Hudson, Perry A. Hudson, Grantors herein, and Ernest B. Hudson and Clifton B. Hudson, all of which will more fully appear in Apt. 527, File 15, Probate Court for Greenville County. Subsequently, Clifton B. Hudson died intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Jane A. Hudson, his mother, Eva L. Hudson, his brothers, Homer C. Hudson, Roy O. Hudson, Perry E. Hudson, a sister, Lucille H. Jones, and his brother, Ernest B. Hudson. Jane A. Hudson, the wife of Clifton B. Hudson, conveyed her interest to this property to certain Grantors herein by deed dated May 1, 1957, recorded in Deed Book 579, Page 250. Subsequently, Ernest B. Hudson died intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law the Grantors, Louise B. Hudson, his wife, and the following children, Bruce F. Hudson, Glen W. Hudson, and Raymond E. Hudson, all of which will more fully appear by reference to Apt. 767, File 23, Probate Court for Greenville County.

McCALL, JR., a Trustees for Laurie Farr Moseley, et al., under a trust agreement dated September 17, 1963, their successors and assigns, forever, in trust, however, for the following uses and purposes; the said Trustees are to hold, manage and dispose of the property herein conveyed in accordance with the powers and duties as set forth in said Trust Indenture, including inter alia, the power to borrow money in their names, upon such terms and conditions as they may deem advisable, and to mortgage all or any part of said property herein conveyed, as security for the repayment thereof, and without any obligation upon the lender to see to the use of the proceeds of such loans, and to repay all such borrowed money from income or principal as in his

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
