## WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, The parties hereto own adjoining property in Greenville County contiguous to Saluda River being shown on plat of property of Cherry Investment Co. prepared by W. T. Riddle, Surveyor, February 17, 1938, recorded in Plat Book JJJ at Page 181, the tract owned by George L. Irwin being shown as 6.40 acres (see Deed Book 766, Page 358) and the tracts owned by Jack D. Parker being shown as 20.00 acres and also the tract of land adjacent to and east of said 20.00 acre tract and north of tract 4, (See Deed Book 332, Page 301 and Deed Book 768, Page 213); and

WHEREAS, Access to and along said 6.40 acre tract of George L. Irwin and to and along said 20.00 acre tract of Jack D. Parker is provided as shown on said plat by a private roadway or easement crossing the aforementioned tract east of the 20.00 acre tract and north of the said tract 4; and

WHEREAS, The parties hereto desire to provide for a common easement in perpetuity for their respective tracts of land and as easements appurtenant thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That Jack D. Parker does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George L. Irwin, his heirs and assigns, a non-exclusive right of way and easement across property of said Jack D. Parker thirty (30) feet in width and being appurtenant to property of said George L. Irwin, the center line of said easement being described as follows on said plat:

Commencing at a point on a county road in line of tract 4 (said point being N. 67-45 E. along said country road 209 feet from the southwesterly corner of the 6.40 acre tract of George L. Irwin) and running thence N. 53-30 W. 259.5 feet to point in easterly boundary of said 20.00 acre tract, reserving, however, unto said Jack D. Parker, his heirs and assigns, the non-exclusive right and privilege
