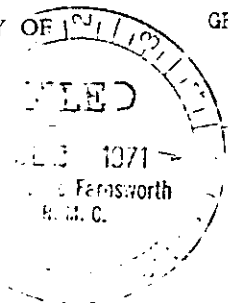

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That
L.F. FEW

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of
TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) and love and affection

to Me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
by NEVES FEW

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said NEVES FEW, and his heirs and assigns forever,

a one-half (1/2) interest in
/all that piece, parcel or lot of land in O'Neal Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, being known as a part of the old F.A. Bonar Hempley Land, now known as the Few's Dairy Property and consisting of two tracts having the following courses and distances, to-wit:

FIRST TRACT: BEGINNING on a stone on the South side of the Saluda Gap Road and runs thence N. 47 E. 12.20 chains to a stone; thence N. 66-1/2 E. 17.70 chains to a stake on the branch; thence up the branch 19.45 chains to a stake; thence S. 63-1/2 W. 20.10 chains to a point in the Saluda Gap Road; thence up said road N.25 W. 14.07 chains to a stone on the South side of the Saluda Gap Road, the BEGINNING corner, containing 43 acres, more or less, bounded by lands of Mary Mears Duncan Lands and others.

This being the same property conveyed to the grantor by deed of O.K. Bonar, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Volume L, at Page 000.

SECOND TRACT: BEGINNING on a stone near a branch, the Duncan corner, and runs thence S. 63-1/2 W. 33.60 chains to a stone; thence S. 30 W. 9.80 chains to a stone; thence N. 19-1/2 E. 18.20 chains to a stone; thence N. 59-1/2 E. 11.50 chains to a persimmon on the south side of the Saluda Gap Road; thence down said road S. 25 W. 14.07 chains to a point in said road; thence N. 03-1/2 E. 20.10 chains to a stake on the branch; thence down said branch S. 7 E. 2.70 chains to stone, the BEGINNING corner, containing 29 acres, more or less, bounded by lands of Henry Gosnell, L.Barton Estate and others.

This being the same property conveyed to the grantor by deed of Mary B. Meares recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Volume K, at page 553.
