Elevation

In general, the site is characterized by gently rolling uplands with occasional low hills and ridges. The site consists of two major stream valleys, extending southeasterly and northeasterly across the property. Between the valleys are small, moderately steep ridges. The ridge edges fall off at moderate to steep angles into the drainage ways in many areas, sometimes attaining slopes of over 25%.

Elevations on the site range from 880 feet to 1050 feet above mean sea level. The highest point is located in the north end of the site along Roberts Road. The lowest point is located in the floodplain of Mountain Creek on the eastern side of the park.
