- (p) In general, to do all other acts, deeds, matters, and things whatsoever in or about my estate, property, and affairs, or to concur with persons jointly interested with myself therein in doing all acts, deeds, matters, and things herein, either particularly or generally described, as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as I could do in my own person if personally present and competent.
- 3. <u>CONSTRUCTION</u>. This instrument is to be construed and interpreted as a general power of attorney. The enumeration of specific items, acts, rights, or powers herein does not limit or restrict, and it is not to be construed or interpreted as limiting or restricting the general powers herein granted to my attorney.
- 4. <u>REVOCATION</u>. This general power of attorney revokes any previous powers of attorney granted by me. This general power of attorney may be voluntarily revoked only by me at any time by my written revocation entered of record in the deed records of Hunt County, Texas.
- 5. <u>DISABILITY</u>. This general power of attorney shall not terminate on disability of the principal.
- 6. NO BOND REQUIRED. No attorney-in-fact shall be obligated to furnish bond or other security.
- 7. <u>LIMITATIONS</u>. Any authority granted to my attorney herein shall be limited so as to prevent this general power of attorney from causing my attorney to be taxed on my income (unless my attorney is my spouse) and from causing my assets to be subject to a general power of appointment by my attorney, as that term is defined in Section 2041 of the Internal Revenue Code.
- 8. CONFIRMATION OF ATTORNEY'S ACTS. I hereby ratify and confirm all that my attorney-in-fact or his successors shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue of this
