

This Indenture made the fifth day of February in the year of our Lord
One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty nine, and in the thirtieth year
of American Independence Between William Stripland of the State of South
Carolina and Newberry County of the one part and William Reed of the State
aforesaid and County of Greenville of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
William Stripland for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Shillings Sterling
to him in hand paid by the said William Reed the receipt of which is hereby
acknowledged he the said William Stripland hath bargained and sold and by
these presents doth bargain and sell all that plantation or tract of two hundred
acres of land being the said tract granted unto the said William Stripland by
Patent bearing date the fourth day of December One thousand Seven hun:
dred and Eighty Six and in the Eleventh year of American Independence
lying and binding on a branch of Rocky Creek & waters of Reedy River in
the State aforesaid and district of Ninety Six now called County. Recorded in
the Secretarys Office in book B B B B page 209. reference therunto had more
fully appears the same now intended to be thus conveyed being the said tract
of two hundred acres of land lying on a branch of Rocky Creek beginning on a
Red oak runs thence N Sixty five W Sixty eight chains to Stake thence N twenty
