



South Carolina This Indenture made the second day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine, and in the thirteenth year of the Independence of the United States of America. Between Thomas Scogin planter and Hannah his wife of the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid of the one part, and John Westfield planter of the County of Greenville and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds Sterling money to him in hand paid by the said John Westfield at or before the Sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain, and sell unto the said John Westfield his heirs Executors and administrators and assigns All that plantation or tract of land containing three hundred and ninety seven acres lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, above the antient boundary on the West ~~branch~~ branch of the Golden Grove Creek waters of Saluda River and hath such shape form and marks as by a plat to the said grant annexed. Together with all and singular the Houses out houses, woods and woods, timber and timber trees, ways, paths, passages, wells, waters and water courses, profits, commodities, emoluments, hereditaments, rights members and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said plantation or tract of land and all and singular the premises herein before mentioned or meant to be hereby bargained and sold with the appurtenances unto the said John Westfield his heirs Executors, administrators and assigns from the day next before the day of the date of these presents for and during and unto the full end and term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and to be complete and ended Yielding and paying thereof unto the said Thomas Scogin his heirs or assigns the rent of one Pepper corn only on the last day of the said term if the same shall be lawfully demanded to the intent and purpose that by virtue of these presents and of the Statute for transferring of uses into possession made of force in this State the said John Westfield may be in the actual possession of all and singular the said premises and may lawfully be thereby enabled to take and accept a grant and release of the reversion and inheritance thereof to him his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and benefit and behoof of him the said John Westfield his heirs and assigns forever by Indenture of release intended to be made between the said Thomas Scogin and Hannah his wife of the one part and John Westfield of the other part and to bear day the day next after the day of the date of these presents.
