This Indenture made the third day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, and in thirteenth year of the Independence of the United States of America, between Thomas Srogin of Greenville County and State of South Carolina planter of the one part, and Thomas Dogwood of the State and County aforesaid planter of the other part, Whereas in and by a certain grant bearing date the second day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty six and in the eleventh year of the Independence of the United States of America from and under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor and commander in chief of the said State and the great Seal of the said State for that purpose appointed did give and grant unto Thomas Srogin a plantation or tract of land containing two hundred acres situate lying and being in County aforesaid on Brushy Creek waters of Saluda River being when surveyed bounded on all sides by vacant land having such shape form and marks as appears by a plat thereof to the said grant annexed as in and by the said plat and grant duly recorded in the Secretarys office of the said State in book XXXX page 644 reference therunto had may more fully appear. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Thomas Srogin for and in consideration of the sum of Forty pounds Sterling to him in hand well and truly paid by the said Thomas Dogwood the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Thomas Srogin hath bargained sold remised released conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien remise release convey and confirm unto the said Thomas Dogwood in his actual possession now being by virtue of a bargain and sale to him thereof made for one whole year and by force of the Statute for transferring of uses into possession and to his heirs & assigns forever All that tract of land as aforesaid containing two hundred acres, Together with all and singular the Houses outhouses Buildings barns Stables yards gardens orchards woods underwoods timber and timber trees meadows pastures ponds lakes ways waters water courses paths passages liberties privileges profits hereditaments rights mem- bers and appurtenances what soever therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion ~~and~~ or reversions remainder or remainders
