South Carolina Greenville County November the seventeenth one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine. Release and release for six hundred and forty acres of land from Daniel Jackson to Christopher Brunk Sen^r produced in open court having been proved before Am: Brose Blackburn Esquire, and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the twenty fourth day of September one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, and in the fourteenth year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America: Between Daniel Jackson of Union County South Carolina of the one part, and Christopher Brunk Sen^r of Greenville County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of five Shillings to the said Daniel Jackson in hand well and truly paid by the said Christopher Brunk Sen^r: at and before the sealing and delivery hereof (the receipt hereof, is hereby acknowledged) hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Christopher Brunk Sen^r: his Executors and assigns, all that plantation or tract of land containing six hundred and forty acres Situate lying and being in the County aforesaid on Mountain Creek of Saluda River including the fork of the said Creek; beginning at a post oak 37 thence North 10° E 80 chains to a Hickory 37 thence North 80° West 80 chains to a Pine 37 thence South 10 West 80 chains to a Stake 37 thence South 80 E 80 chains to the beginning (being a tract of land originally granted to William Neel by grant, bearing date the 25th of January 1785 recorded in the Secretarys office Book C 66 page 337) reference being thereunto had may more fully appear; and conveyed by said William Neel to said Jackson by Deed of Conveyance &c. Together with all and singular, the Gardens, Orchards, Trees, ways, wells, waters, water courses, Easements, profits, commodities, advantages, Emoluments, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever, to the said plantation or tract of land, containing six hundred and forty acres, belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainders and remainders thereof and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said plantation or tract of land, all and singular the promises herein before mentioned and intended to be here by bargained and sold with their, and every of their appurtenances unto the
