Know all men by these Presents that I John Payne sen. of the State and District aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings sterling money to me in hand paid by Henry Paris of the State and District aforesaid, & for certain other good causes moving me think have given granted and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry Paris his heirs and assigns all that Plantation a tract of land whereon John Payne now lives containing seventy four acres (be the same more or less) of land it being part of a tract of one hundred and seventy four acres of land purchased of Ruben Boopland and having such shape form & marks as more fully appears by reference to the original Plat. Together with all and singular the rights, issues, profits, tenements belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold all & singular the said premises to him the said Henry Paris his heirs and assigns forever. And I the said John Payne sen. doth bind myself my heirs and every of them to warrant and forever defend the said tract of twenty four acres of land (be the same more or less) unto him the said Henry Paris his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs, and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - And also the whole of my goods and chattels to be the right title and Estate of the said Henry Paris his heirs and assigns forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this first Day of June eighteen hundred and eleven, and of the Independence of the United States of America the twenty fifth - Signed Sealed & Delivered in the presence of Rob<sup>t</sup>. Elgin, Elizabeth Paris, Luranch Paris, John Payne sen. S. Carolina S. District Personally appeared Rob<sup>t</sup>. Elgin before me the subscribing Justice and made oath in due form that he did see John Payne sen. assign seal & as his act & Deed deliver the within Deed of Conveyance for the uses & purposes therein mentioned, and that Elizabeth Paris & Luranch Paris together with himself in the presence of each other were subscribing witnesses to the same.
