State South Carolina Know all men by these presents that J. John Waldrop of
Greenville District for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred & Twenty six
Dollars to me paid by George Belue of the District aforesaid, have granted bargained sold
and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the said George
Belue, a plantation or tract of land lying and being in the district aforesaid on a small
Creek, on the N^o Side of S^o Pacolats river, Beginning at a Spanish oak and running thence
N^o 65. E. 32. Ch. to a red oak thence N^o 5 W. 4 Ch. 50 links to a red oak thence N^o 45 W. 9 Ch.
to the creek at the mouth of a branch on the N^o Side thence up the various meanders of the
Branch to a Chesnut thence N^o 65. E. 28 Ch. 50 links to a black oak M. Elcus Corner thence
with his line S^o 17. E. 23 Ch. to a Black oak, Moses White Corner thence with his line a
S^o West course crossing the creek to the, Beginning containing by estimation one hundred
and seven acres be the same more or less being part of Two tracts the lower end supposed
to be sixty acres Granted to John Fowen by patent bearing date October 3. 1791.
The other end and upper part Granted by patent to William Clayton bearing date May 6.
1793. Supposed to contain Fifty acres including the improvement then said Waldrop
now lives. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and
appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining, To have and to
hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George Belue, and
I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors or administrators to warrant and for ever
defend all and singular the said premises unto the said George Belue his heirs and assigns
against me and my heirs and against every person, whomsoever lawfully claiming
the same or any part thereof. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this Twenty sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and
thirteen and thirty seventh year of American Independency. Signed sealed & Delivered
