

Count house and running thence N. 15 chains 50 links to a Hickory thence N. 82 E 23 chains to a red oak, thence South 16 chains to a Stake on the bank of the Creek thence up the meander of the Creek to the beginning containing by estimation Sixty two acres, be the same more or less, being the north End of a survey granted to Augustus Murrick, bearing date Jan'y 13<sup>th</sup> 1787 and by him conveyed to Madson & Turpin, & by them to Geo Lewis, and by him to James Butler, and by him to Charles Whitten & by him to me - Together with all and singular the rights, members here- ditamentally and appurtenances therunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold all and singular, the above mentioned premises unto the said William his heirs and assigns for ever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend the same unto the said William his heirs and assigns against me & my heirs and against every person or persons whomsoever laying any lawful claim a title therunto, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & Thirteen, and thirty seventh Year of American Independence: Signed Sealed & delivered in presence of William Dill, Willey S. Brown

Know all all men by these Presents that I Francis Hamilton of of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of one hundred and twenty five dollars to me in hand paid by Samuel Nabors of Greenville District and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold, & by these "presents" do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel Nabors all that piece parcel or tract of land containing one hundred acres of land (be the same more or less) Situate in the District aforesaid on Saluda river, bounded N. on said River S. on Thomas Kimman all other sides on Samuel Nabors. Together with all and singular the rights, members here-ditamentally and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Samuel Nabors his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend unto the said Samuel Nabors his heirs and assigns all and singular the said premises against myself and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. As Witness my hand and seal the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Eleven and in the thirty fifth year of the Independence of the United States of America. - Signed Sealed and delivered in presence of Blaspingame Nabors, Mary Stone
