in Chief at Columbia this first day of December one thousand seven hundred and
ninety in the twenty fifth year of the Independence of the United States of America, thence
Conveyed from Alexandria to Flemming Hatcher, and from Hatcher to Edward Nash,
Situate in the district of Laurens, beginning on a Hickory Corner, thence Conditional line to
a Post Oak thence N. to a Hickory thence West to Andrew McNight's line thence along said
line to the begining Corner, Butting and lying on the waters of ^{the} South fork of Robins Creek
Together with all and singular the rights members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the
said premises, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold all &
singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Edward Nash his heirs and assigns forever.
And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant & for ever
defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Edward Nash his heirs and
assigns against myself my heirs and no further, lawfully claiming or to claim the or
any part thereof, Wtch wch my hand and seal this 2^d day of October in the Year Eighteen
hundred & twelve, and in the thirty sixth year of the Independence of the United States of
America - Signed sealed & delivered in the presence of ^{his} Flemming Hatcher ^{L.S.}

South Carolina Laurens District. This day personally appeared Alexander Bates
before me one of the Justices for said district, made oath in due form of law and saith
on said Oath that he was present and did see Flemming Hatcher sign seal & as his
act and deed deliver the aforesaid to Edward Nash to have for the use and purposes
therin mentioned and that he did see Samuel Smith sign his name as a witness to
the same, as with himself - Sworn to and subscribed to before me this 2^d day of October 1812.

of the sum of forty Dollars to me paid by Edward Nash of the District in the State aforesaid
have granted bargained sold and released and by these Presents do grant bargain sell & release
unto the said Edward Nash a part or parcel of land containing forty acres, or the same more or less
originally granted to Joseph Alexandria by his Excellency John Drayton Commander in Chief at
Columbia this first day of December one thousand seven hundred and ninety in the twenty fifth year
of the Independence of the United States of America, thence Conveyed from Alexandria to Flemming Hatcher
and from Flemming Hatcher to Edward Nash, Situate in the district of ~~Keenwells~~ Laurens, beginning
on a black oak corner thence a Conditional line to a Stake corner, South 40 Deg. E. 80' thence along
said line to a Stake, thence to a Hickory corner, thence to a Post Oak, from thence to McNight's
line, thence N. to a Hickory, thence closing on Nash's old line, butting and lying on the
waters of Robins Creek, Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appur-
tenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining: To have & to
hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Edward Nash his heirs & assigns
against myself my heirs and no further, lawfully claiming or to claim the or any part thereof
