


292 By the Governor of South Carolina, bearing date the second day of February Anno Domini 1789 reference to said Grant, with all & every part thereof timber and timber trees waters and water courses unto the said David Armstrong him & his heirs Executors assigns from the day of the date hereof forever To have and To hold every part and parcel thereof & of the said Andrew Thomson, me & my heirs Executors administrators and assigns and all persons under me do quit all manner of Claims unto all and every part of the above mentioned tract of Two hundred and Forty acres of Land and the said David Armstrong is to peacefully enjoy the said tract of Land without any trouble or molestation from the day of the date hereof forever. In witness whereof the said Andrew Thomson hath set his hands & affixed his seal this Seventh day of January in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred & four. Signed sealed & delivered in presence of
James Ashew, Lawson Thompson. — Andrew Thomson

State of South Carolina Greenville District Know all men these presents that I John Blankenship of District & State aforesaid for and in consideration of Two Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by John Alexander of District and State aforesaid have Granted bargained sold and released and by the presents do grant bargain sell and release to the said John Alexander a parcel or tract of Land containing Two Hundred acres more or less it being a part of five hundred acres originally Granted to Isaac Perkins by Patent the fourth day of April 1796 & recorded in Grant Book C. 1. 5 page 396 Situated in District and State aforesaid on both sides of Gray Branch waters of Gilders Creek and Enore River including the plantation whereon said Blankenship now lives Beginning on a Stake corner on the original line and dividing line or between the Davis and Edward Prince and run on the original line due N^o 50 Chains to a Stake corner of the old aforesaid tract, thence N^o 20. W 50 Chains to a Post oak corner, thence N. 60. E. 54. 50 to a post oak corner on John Butlers line, thence due South 69 Chains to a Stake corner thence a direct line to the beginning. To go thus with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining unto the said John Alexander his heirs Executors & administrators & assigns I the said John Blankenship do hereby bind myself —
