State of South Carolina. Know all men by these Presents that I Joshua Hawkins of Green- 297
ville District and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of three hundred and
fifty⁰⁰ dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Wynne of the District aforesaid
the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge Have granted, bargained sold
conveyed and Confirmed and by these Presents do Grant bargain sell convey
and Confirm unto the said Thomas Wynne his heirs and assigns a certain
parcel or tract of land containing by estimation one hundred and fifty four
acres, be the same more or less, Situate in Greenville District aforesaid on the
head branches of Brummitz Creek and other branches of the north fork of
Saluda River being part of a Tract of two hundred and seventy six acres of
land originally granted to Samuel French by grant bearing date the fifth day
of June one thousand seven hundred and Eighty Six, and part of a tract
of land granted to Thomas M. Carrell adjoining the above tract, & being
as follows (that is to say) Beginning on a Rock on Samuel French's S. E. line
forty rods from his pine Corner, Thence to a Stake on the conditional line
then with Samuel M. Carrell's marked line to the spring branch near
Fords old field, thence down the meanders of said branch to a Stake on M^c
Carrell's line, thence said M^cCarrell's line to a small poplar, thence with a
late marked line fifty rods to a small red oak, thence a straight line
a Southward Course one hundred and twenty eight rods, to a red oak
thence a marked line fifty rods, to a wild crab apple tree on or near
M^cCarrell's old line, thence with said old line to a red oak, thence to the
beginning. Together with all and singular the rights members
hereditaments and appurtenances to said premises belonging or
