 I Samuel Being Thomas & the said Samuel Hill by my bonds or obligations bearing  
 date with these presents, stand indebted to Paschal Smithson of Greenville District  
 and State of South Carolina in the sum of nine hundred Dollars to be paid unto the  
 s<sup>r</sup> Paschal Smithson his certain attorney, his heirs, Executors administrators or  
 assigns in the following manner Viz. Three hundred on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day  
 of December 1814. Three hundred on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December  
 1815 and the other Three hundred Dollars on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of  
 December 1816 as in and by the s<sup>d</sup> sum of Nine hundred Dollars to the Paschal  
 Smithson have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell and  
 in plain and open market Deliver to the s<sup>r</sup> Paschal Smithson a certain tract of land  
 whereon the s<sup>r</sup> Hill now lives & also a Grise Mill and all the appertanances there  
 unto belonging the Mill situate on Gilders Creek and the tract of land situate on  
 both side of s<sup>r</sup> Creek beginning at a Sweet Gum 2<sup>om</sup> for John M. Smithson thence  
 on Andrew M. Cray line S. E. to a pine Corner thence continued on s<sup>r</sup> M. Cray  
 line to a P. O. 3<sup>om</sup> on South side of Austins Waggon Road thence up the  
 meanders of s<sup>r</sup> Road to Nathaniel Dacus line thence southward on s<sup>r</sup> line to  
 Gilders Creek thence Down the meanders of s<sup>r</sup> Creek to an old line made for  
 John Peak thence on s<sup>r</sup> line S. 15 E. to a St. 3<sup>om</sup> thence S 72 E to a P. O. 3<sup>om</sup>
