fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Stephen Patton of Greenville district in the State aforesaid
hath granted bargained sold and released unto the said Stephen Patton one certain tract
of land containing one hundred and sixty four acres, more or less, Situate lying and
being in Greenville district on the East side of Saluda river in the State aforesaid, being
part of a tract of land originally granted to Robert Gilleland, and signed by his excellency
William Moultrie Esq^r the then Governor on the 5th day of December in the year of 1785.
and recorded in grant book G. G. G. G. page 280 and afterwards conveyed by said Gilleland
to William Pogue and from said Pogue to Nathan Waddell. Beginning on a Post oak on John
Bowies line, thence along the original line to where it intersects a line originally run for David
Sentry, now occupied by Barksdale Garrison, thence along the old line, thence to the
line of a tract of land laid out for Alexander Gilleland, thence along the original line to a
black oak, being a condition line from thence a direct line to the beginning corner, but
still a conditional line. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments
and appurtenances, to the said premises, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have
and to hold, all and singular the premises, before mentioned unto the said Stephen Patton his heirs &
assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators, to warrant &
forever defend all and singular the said premises, unto the said Stephen Patton his heirs &
assigns against myself and my heirs and all other persons lawfully claiming or to claim all or any
