burg District, in the State ofesaid in consideration of Ten dollars to me paid by ^{John} Jones of Greenville
District in the State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant
bargain sell and release unto the said John Jones all that Plantation or Tract of Land, containing five
hundred acres Situate in the district and State aforesaid on a branch of the Golden Grove Creek called
Zacharias branch (Surveyed for Robert Craven the fifth of January one thousand seven hundred &
eighty five) and bounded when surveyed by vacant land, on three sides, and on the other by
land laid out for Henry Pendleton, granted to the said Francis Bremer on the third day of April
one thousand seven hundred and eighty six, and having such shape marks and courses as are represented
in a plat to the original Grant annexed, a reference to which will more fully appear. Together
with all and singular the rights number hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging or in
any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises above
mentioned, unto the said John Jones his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself
my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises
unto the said John Jones his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs, but against
no other person whatsoever. Witness my hand and Seal this third day of April in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen and in the thirty ninth year of the
