

Know all men by these presents that I William Ayres of Greenville distill and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & eighty seven dollars to me paid by Lemuel J. Alston of said district, have granted bargained sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Lemuel J. Alston all that Plantation or Tract of land situate in the district aforesaid, on the South Fork of bushy Creek of Keedy river, Beginning on a black Gum, near the bank of Creek, thence N. 70° E 13.50 to a White Oak, Nutt corner, thence N. 45° E 19 to a black Oak, thence S. 60° E. 26 to a Stake near a branch of Bushy Creek, thence down the various meanders of said Creek to its Confluence near the black gum corner. Containing one hundred & twenty five acres, more or less, Together with all & singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises before mentioned, to the said Lemuel J. Alston his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs & Administrators to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said Lemuel J. Alston his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs & against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of May in the Year of our Lord 1814, and in the 37<sup>th</sup> year of the Independence of the United States of America.
