The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these Presents that I Solomon Kemp of the State aforesaid and district of Greenville in consideration of one hundred dollars to me paid by William Brown all that State and district aforesaid, have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Brown all that Plantation or tract of land containing fifty acres more or less lying & being in Greenville district on the cane break branch of Enoree river, beginning at a Stake, running N. 20 E. 60 to a Post Oak Corner, thence from S. Post Oak Corner running a Conditionally line to a white oak corner on S. Cane break branch, thence S. branch to be the line up to a poplar corner thence S. 72 : 25 to the beginning. Together with all & singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Brown his heirs & assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said William Brown his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. To have and to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Brown his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said William Brown his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand & seal this 21st of April 1813 — interlined before signed
