


 June in the year of our Lord 1814, and in the thirty Eighth year of the

 Hundred dollars to me in hand paid in a Negro boy named Jack by Jonathan  
 Davis of State and district aforesaid, the Receipt of which boy I do hereby  
 acknowledge, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do  
 grant bargain sell alien and release unto the said Jonathan Davis a certain  
 Plantation or tract of Land lying and being in the district and State aforesaid,  
 containing one hundred and thirty Eight acres be the same more or less,  
 a part of a tract of Land granted to Thomas Fairlow, containing Eight hundred  
 and sixty five acres bearing date the Eighth day of July one thousand seven  
 hundred seventy four the land hereby conveyed has such shape & form as may  
 appear by a plat of the same beginning at a Spanish oak 34 and runs N. 25  
 W. 27 Ch. to a Stake 34 thence S. 48 W. 41 Ch. to a post oak 34 thence N. 50 W. 11  
 Ch. to Stake 34 thence S. 42 W. 16 Ch. 30 Lks. to 120 oak 34 thence S. 33 W. 28 Ch.  
 72 links to Stone 34 thence S. 32 E. 23 Ch. to the Beginning, Together with all
