of three hundred dollars to me in hand paid, have this day bargained sold  
and released and by these presents do bargain sell and release unto John  
M. Curston of the district of Greenville and State aforesaid him his heirs, assigns &c.  
all that plantation or tract of Land which the said John M. Curston now  
lives originally granted to John Pitty on the first day of December 1788. Situate  
lying and being in the district of Greenville on the water of Rocky Creek of  
Roedy River containing two hundred acres, be the same more or less, and  
hath shape & form as followeth to wit, Beginning at a lightwood stake on  
John Baldwin's line & runs N. E. 70. 50 to a Spanish oak on thence along  
on Henry Stokes line N. W. 20. 54 to a black oak & thence on Love & Nicholson's
