

11. 1/2. or parcel of land supposed to contain in the whole six hundred and thirty  
three acres to the same more or less (not warranting as to quantity) situated in the  
District of Greenville near the head of Reedy River and known by the name of the  
sign of the White Horse and the Reasonover plantation adjoining to the same  
including four plantations, tracts, or parcels of land one for 132 acres granted to  
John Reasonover the 4<sup>th</sup> of April 1796 and conveyed from him to John B. Elkin  
the 8<sup>th</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1802 one for 132 acres conveyed from Joseph Reasonover to the S<sup>r</sup>.  
Elkin on the same day one for 219 acres conveyed from Jacob Reasonover to the  
said Elkin on the same day and one for one hundred and fifty acres being  
part of a tract of land originally granted to Jacob Gardiner the 18<sup>th</sup> of April 1785  
conveyed from Gardiner to N. Fisher from Fisher to N. Wood and from Wood  
to the said Elkin the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June 1802. the whole conveyed from the said  
Elkin to the said Earle the 14<sup>th</sup> day of September 1805. and included in the  
lines and courses following, to wit: Beginning on a stake on the East side of  
Reedy River at the Edge of the swamp near where Gardiner's old line crosses  
thence thence S. 39 N. 7. 50 to a stake coze corner thence S. 56 to a stake Coze  
Corner thence N. 81 W. to a black jack stump 35:50 thence N. 25 W. 12 to a  
Post oak thence S. 75 W. 25 to a Hickory in a field thence N. 16 to a Post oak  
thence N. 80 W. 9:50 to a pine stump thence N. 15 W. 33:50 to a Red oak  
thence N. 50 E. 11 to a pine thence N. 11:50 to a stake on Gardiner's old line  
thence S. 77 E. about 33 chains to a stake and Pointing a conditional corner  
agreed upon and marked by and between said Earle & David M. Coy  
thence N. 16 E. 21 to a post oak corner between said M. Coy and Goodlett thence  
along a conditional line between said Goodlett and the White Horse tract  
N. 73 E. 47:50 to a stake on the East side of Reedy River at the Edge of the  
dry land thence down the meander of the swamp and <sup>Edge of the</sup> dry land to the  
Beginning; having such shapes form and marks as the annexed plat  
Represents. Together with all and singular the Rights, members hereditament  
and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise Incident  
or appertaining To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before  
mentioned unto the said Samuel Richard, his heirs and assigns forever  
and I the said Elias Earle do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executors and  
administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises  
before mentioned unto the said Samuel Richard, his heirs and assigns against  
myself and my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever  
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand  
and seal this twenty second day of November in the year of our Lord one  
thousand Eight hundred and thirteen, and in the 38<sup>th</sup> year of the American  
Independence. — signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of.
