State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I John Hightower of the district of Greenville and State beforeid for and in Consideration of six hundred and fifty dollar to me in hand paid by Alfred Hightower of the district aforesaid the Receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged it has granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Alfred Hightower a tract or parcel of land it being in four Survey lying and being in the district of Greenville on the branchy of the Beavardam creek water of the North fork of Saluda River the first survey being part of a tract of land granted to Robt Prince by his excellency William Pinckney Esq Governor of South Carolina and hath such boundaries as following.

Begining on a pine which is a conditional corner made between John Hightower alias Alfred Hightower on the old line thence N. 2° W. 4 chain 27 links to a post oak conditional corner thence N. 52° E. 11 chain to a white oak high a conditional corner at the head of Adams old spring branch thence down said branch to the mouth thence up the main big branch to the back line then beginning on the above conditional pine corner running N. 10° W. 13 chain 50 links to a poplar corner thence N. 20° E. 27 chain 55 links to a post oak corner thence S. 88° E. 19 chain to a white oak station on the branch above mentioned containing forty acres to the same more or less in the said boundary the second Survey beginning on a poplar running N. 20° E. 25 chain 50 links to a Hickory corner thence N. 49° W. 36 chain to a rock corner thence N. 22° W. 10 chain to a Hickory corner thence S. 20° W. 36 chain to a Stake thence S. 58° E. 35 chain to the beginning corner containing one hundred acres was granted to Master Adams by His Excellency Charles Pinckney Esq. Governor of South Carolina granted the fourth
