Gowen for and in consideration of the sum of Nine hundred and sixty dollars to me in hand paid by Sterling Harry both of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargained and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & Release unto the said Harry a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the State and district aforesaid on both sides of the sinkhole fork of Sugar River, Beginning on a large sweet gum near the said Sugar River running N. 54 E. 3. to a willow on the bank of a branch thence up the various meandering of said branch about 54 chains to a poplar W. 1/2 of corner thence N. 42 W. 39 chains to two chestnuts thence N. 32 chains to a Pot oak stump near Hannah's Railway fence thence S. 10 W. 14 Ch. to a dead live oak Laban Loftis corner thence N. 47 W. 9 chains to a chestnut thence S. 41. 50 to a small live oak thence N. 70 E. 27 chains to the beginning, supposed to contain one hundred & eighty Eight acres be the same more or less it being part of a survey of land granted to John Gowen deceased and by his last will bequeathed to me appurtenance to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident To Have and To Hold all and singular the said premises unto the said Harry his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby warrant and forever defend all and singular the before mentioned premises unto the said Harry his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs executors or administrators or any other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - As witness my hand and seal this fourteenth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifteen and 39<sup>th</sup> year of American Independence signed sealed and delivered in presence of J. P. Jackson and Joseph Barton.

Know all men by these presents that I John Cunningham of the County of Washington and State of Georgia for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty dollars in hand paid to me by John Bottom of the district of Chatham and State of South Carolina have granted bargained sold Relinquished and Released and I do by these presents grant bargain sell Relinquish and Release unto the said John Bottoms all that meager tract or parcels of lands lying & being in the district of Greenville and State of South Carolina containing forty acres more or less the same being a part of a tract of land originally granted to John Liberty on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of October 1788 and had off to me the said John Cunningham as follows Viz Beginning on a black oak 34 from thence to a hickory on the original line 34 from thence to an ash corner on the branch 34 thence down the meandering of the branch to the fork on said line from thence to a post oak corner 34 thence along the original line to the beginning. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenance to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appurtenance To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Bottom his heirs assigns Executors and
