 22 W. 8. 83 to a lightwood stake thence S. 80 W. to a Chestnut sapling thence
 to the Beginning, but being part of a tract of land whereon James Smith formerly
 lived and sold by said Smith to John Burn and by said Burn to S. Bradley
 Together with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments & appurtenances
 in anywise in anywise incident or appertaining to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining
 unto the said Thomas Benson his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind my
 self my heirs & assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the
 said land and premises unto the said Thomas Benson his heirs and assigns
