witnesses to the due Execution of the same. Sworn to and subscribed before  
me this thirtieth day of August one thousand Eight hundred Sixteen.

Greenville district in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of twenty five  
dollars and other valuable considerations, to me paid by Elias Earle Esq.  
of Pendleton district in the said State, have granted bargained sold and  
Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell bind & release unto  
the said Elias Earle all that part of a tract of land originally granted  
to William Smith on the third day of April 1786, surveyed for him the 12<sup>th</sup>  
day of April 1785, situate in the then district of Ninety six now Greenville  
district on the head branches of Horse River bounded at the time of the  
original survey on three sides by vacant land on the other side by William  
Young's survey the part herein conveyed begins at a double corner a  
Spanish and black oak corner near the side of the wagon road on the East  
side of it on the lower or south line of the original survey next to Fred K.  
Hawkins' running thence with the original line N.E. course to the original corner  
next to Parrot Mountain thence on the other original line Northwardly to what  
is called the grape branch, thence up that branch to Aquilla Bradleys line,  
thence with his and Montgomery's line to the Beginning so as to include all  
the land hitherto sold by Elias Earle to John Salmon and to Griffin  
or Hall at present occupied by Alexander Montgomery and Henry Hall &  
supposed to contain in the whole one hundred and thirty acres be the  
same more or less; Together with all and singular the rights, munters heredit  
aments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise inci  
deut or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises  
before mentioned unto the said Elias Earle his Heirs & Assigns forever  
And I do hereby warrant & forever defend all and singular the said  
premises (binding myself my Heirs Executors & Administrators to do so)  
unto the said Elias Earle his Heirs & Assigns against my self & my Heirs  
and against every other person or persons whomsoever claiming by thro  
or under me or under the said grant of William Smith above described  
In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal this Eighth day  
of August in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and  
Sixteen & for the sake of American independence. Sign'd Seal'd and
